Kids play at EMCC's Leadership & Legacy Campus, which is about to see a major transformation.

There are changes coming to the 24,000 square-foot complex on Ralston Avenue, and we want you to be a part of the biggest story Martindale-Brightwood has seen in fifty years.

That building on Ralston was used to recycle oil and treat wastewater. It used to be a symbol of job flight, changing economies, and pollution, but today, we call it our Leadership & Legacy Campus. It is the center of Edna Martin Christian Center's youth programs, and hundreds of kids visit us there every weekday for meals, homework help, and a safe place to play.

When we took over this former Jireh Sports property in 2016, it needed lots of help. But things are happening: The EPA has finished the half-million-dollar job of removing and replacing nearly fourteen million pounds of lead-contaminated soil. There's a blueprint for renovation and expansion, a three-phase master plan to fully utilize the 13-acre site, and there are

Meet Mama Ray! She lives about four blocks from the Edna Martin Christian Center (EMCC), and takes care of her husband since he lost his legs. She's always loved cooking, but since the kids are grown and gone, she's found it hard to cook for just two. Worse, she was getting depressed.

But EMCC has a Culinary Arts class, and when Mama Ray took it, she earned more than her ServSafe® Food Handler Certificate: "My love of cooking resurfaced," she said. "It was an awesome class!"

"One night, chef had a Night of Seasonings, and everybody was supposed to create their own personal blend, and I felt like God said to add [secret ingredient omitted]. Well, everybody loved my spice!" She dreamed of selling her spices, and EMCC Chef Randy Berryhill (who markets his own line of seasonings) encouraged Mama Ray to dream big.

We connected her with our financial coach, Julian Edwards. A small-business course at a local church followed, then a marketing coach, an attorney, branding, and packaging. Today, Mama Ray markets four different blends (All Purpose and the Cajun are her top sellers), and a fifth and a sixth are in development. But just as importantly, she's not depressed anymore. She's lost forty pounds, and her outlook is as vibrant as her seasonings are!

already significant gifts to lead the capital campaign.

The first and most important thing on the agenda will be a new Early Childhood Center that will allow us to serve 88 more children. The \$2-million Phase I will also include renovating and upgrading the infrastructure of the existing building.

Phase II rings the northernmost building with new construction adding offices and classrooms. It also connects the two buildings by adding a main entrance, a lobby, and a multipurpose room. This phase also

comprises the grounds, a greenhouse with a produce stand, and the installation of sports fields. Phase III realizes the dream of a full-fledged child care ministry, adding another third to the size of the complex with new classrooms, a computer lab, and meeting spaces for the community.
