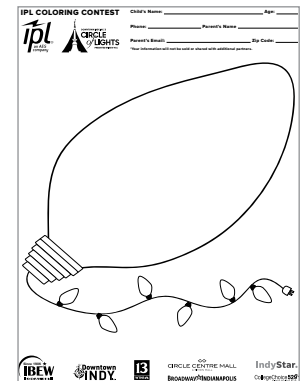
Indiana Landmarks, 1201 Central Ave., Indianapolis

In 1941, Mrs. Martin began what would become the East Side Christian Center. The Center was renamed for her after her passing in 1974.
