

Organization Overview

In our eighty-fourth year of service in Martindale-Brightwood, the Edna Martin Christian Center team continued to walk alongside our neighbors, providing programs, resources, and encouragement that support their goals for stability and growth. Requests for assistance remained high, especially for food and financial supports, reflecting the continued need within our community and EMCC's commitment to respond with compassion and excellence.

Throughout 2024, EMCC focused on strengthening both our organization and our partnerships. We purchased our first lots through our Community-Based Development Organization subsidiary, expanded wellness initiatives for staff, and supported the successful completion of an updated Martindale-Brightwood Quality of Life Plan—a community-driven roadmap that will guide neighborhood priorities for the next five years. With the community's QoL Plan as a foundation, EMCC's board and leadership team completed a Strategic Plan refresh that will guide our work through 2030.

Grounded in faith and guided by vision, EMCC continues to blend proven approaches with innovative new strategies—empowering residents and partners alike to build a peaceful, connected, and thriving Martindale-Brightwood.

Vital Statistics

School-Aged Youth Program

- 195 regularly attending students in grades K-12 were served in high-quality OST programs; regularly attending students are defined by those who have attended programming for at least 60 days
 140 students indicated that they have increased their knowledge of civic responsibility, participating in service learning, as evidenced by semester-end
- student surveys
 150 students demonstrated increased pro-social behaviors (working well in groups, getting along with others who are different than them, and listening to others' ideas), as evidenced by semester-end student



Edna Martin Highlights

Christmas

EMCC hosted several Christmas events in 2024, including our Winter Wonderland, YES Indy Holiday Celebration, Holiday Store, Christmas Night of Lights, and Senior Angels Christmas Party.

Our Simply Santa event, supported by community partner Easterseals, was also part of the celebrations. YES Indy Holiday Celebration saw 7 participants, while the Holiday Store served 30 people through our social services program. Christmas Night of Lights had 5 attendees, and the Senior Angels Christmas Party hosted 22 seniors.



Juneteenth

The week leading up to Juneteenth, we hosted a community arts and music night featuring special speakers, choirs, praise dancers, local art, and vendors.

Continuing a yearly tradition, students, staff, and community members came together for a one-mile Peace Walk through the Martindale-Brightwood neighborhood. Inspired by our students, the walk serves as a meaningful way to stand against racism and violence while promoting peace and community connection.

Thanksgiving

On November 26, 2024, we were privileged to serve over 500 free, hot Thanksgiving meals to the community during our annual Community Thanksgiving Dinner. All EMCC staff helped make the day possible, what a great day of service and celebration!

In Family Success, we hosted a Thanksgiving dinner for the community, while both 37th Place and LLA centered the month around Thanksgiving with special meals for all the children. From November 18–22, 2024, teachers planned a variety of arts and crafts activities, which the children really enjoyed, making the month a fun and festive celebration of gratitude.
